HOMES BOARD AMENDMENTS TO DOCUMENTS

We hope that everyone had a great Thanksgiving. We appreciated the turn out for the Kick-off Amendments meeting. If you were not able to come to the meeting, I can come to your home if you get a group together and we can discuss the importance of passing both of these amendments. Many of us are concerned about our HOA fees, but passing these 2 amendments will bring money into our pockets to help offset these increases. I am enclosing amendments in layman's terms in our current mailing.

The first amendment reflects a beneficial change in Florida Statute Chapter 720 to allow the Rainberry Bay Homes Association to collect past due monies (HOA fees, special assessments, fines, etc.) on the sale of a foreclosed property (bank owned or other purchaser). Without this amendment to our current documents, the Homes Association cannot recover any past due assessments, leaving the homeowners (us) to absorb the remaining debt.

We, the Homes Board, continue to pay for the landscaping, painting and roofing on these properties, in addition to paying the quarterly Masters assessment. This upkeep is coming out of your pocket. By passing this amendment, we will be able to collect monies due from lenders and third-party purchasers at the foreclosure sale! Because we did not pass the Amendment in August 2019, we lost approximately \$20,000 in September.

The second Amendment is intended to simplify the Amendment approval process. This will make it easier to revise the Documents in the future, which may become necessary due to changes in the law or to reflect changes in the desires of the membership. This amendment lowers the requirement for passage from 2/3 (377) yes votes to a simple majority, 50% +1, (283) yes votes of the total homes membership of 565. This will make Homes Documents consistent with Master and Villas who have already approved this change.

The Documents Committee spent a combined 102 hours rewriting these amendments in layman's terms. If we do not pass both of these amendments, it would be senseless to do the entire set of documents. We would not have a leg to stand on when issues come up or the legislature makes changes to Chapter 720 that could benefit us.

The Proxy vote: Please check the box that says a Home's board member will be your proxy. Each one of us is doing the same. Why? If something happens at the last minute and you cannot make the February 18th meeting, at least two of the board members will be there. If you cannot attend and your proxy cannot attend, then there will be 2 ballots that will not count. We need a minimum of 377 ballots to have a quorum. And 377 "YES" votes to pass these amendments! That means for every "NO" vote we need another vote.



FROM THE MASTER BOARD

On behalf of the Rainberry Bay Board of Directors, we wish you a happy and healthy Holiday season, no matter how you celebrate. Where has the time gone? We're wrapping up 2019 and ready to plunge into 2020. Rainberry Bay is now 40 years old and while many things have changed, many have stayed the same.

By now you have all received your copy of the budget for 2020 - if you have not, please contact the office. The Master Board has passed the budget and the new assessment will be effective January 1st. Here is some information that may help if you have questions about the Master Budget.

The largest portion of the increase comes from the new Comcast contract. The contract gives us coverage for three tv sets (the contract ending this year only covered two sets). If you have not already upgraded, we are entitled to two voice-controlled boxes that record, and are now adding a dta (digital adaptor) that you use for a third tv set. We will continue to have HBO as part of our program listings. We are also adding internet coverage. This includes the "Gateway" (modem/route) and wiring to get it working. The cost of internet which has been added

to your maintenance is offset by what you might currently pay for the internet. The cost for the cable came down a bit, the cost of internet added, and overall it results in an increase.

If you do not currently use Comcast for your landline phone and want to switch, do not cancel your current plan if you want to keep the same number. They will take care of the transfer of your current phone number. The phone cost, including fees and taxes, comes to around \$30 per month. The plan includes unlimited calling within the United States and Canada, and 12 popular calling features including Caller ID, call waiting and voicemail. Compare your current bill and see if this doesn't save you some money.

Additionally, there will be an increase in the landscaping portion of the maintenance. I know that folks complain about landscaping but costs have gone up and more money is required for us to get additional staff here to do what we're asking for. Historically, this is nothing new – Beacons from 20 years ago (and even before that) show that to be our number one complaint. The board has not (as of this writing) finalized a landscaping contract for 2020. That news should be available soon!

"Bach is the god of Music"

- Pablo Casals

We haven't screened any Bach operas or ballets for a simple reason – he didn't write any. He did, however, produce hundreds of vocal masterpieces. Indeed, for a long period of his career, his job as Director of the St. Thomas Choir of Leipzig required him to provide musical settings of Biblical texts for Sunday services and holidays. During his career Bach wrote more than 300 such "cantatas," of which some 200 survive. We will hear several of these, performed on the instruments used in Bach's time.

It is worth noting that unlike churchgoers in Bach's time, today's audiences attend performances of the cantatas and other of Bach's sacred works to experience some of the most sublime music to come from the human mind and not for religious instruction. Of course, if one is religious in the way Bach was, the texts are an added dimension, but they should not deter anyone from experiencing this timeless music.

The other offering in December is *The Nutcracker*, the beloved ballet with music by Tchaikovsky. Bring the kids, the grandkids, and the kid in you.

Leigh always knew that she wanted to be in show business. She grew up in a small town on the Mississippi River in Illinois. Her mother was a kindergarten teacher and taught music. Leigh and her mom sang in their church. She took many lessons in singing, dancing, piano and saxophone. Leigh was in all her school plays. At home, she sang and danced along with Broadway show tunes. Her mother recognized Leigh's talent and encouraged her to pursue a stage career. When Leigh went to the Central University of lowa, she majored in Theater.

Tim was raised on a farm in a small town in lowa. He belonged to a 4H Club and competed for prizes and won a Blue Ribbon for showing a prize bull. At the same time, he loved movies and acting. Amazingly, he remembers the first four movies he ever saw: Ben Hur, Old Yeller, Zotz and Son of Flubber! Like Leigh, Tim always acted in school plays, but didn't expect to make a career out of it.

While in college, Tim was interested in studying archeology and ancient history, but he was always enthusiastic about the theater. He wound up with a Theater scholarship at the Central University of lowa. When Tim graduated from college, Leigh was a sophomore. His acting career began at the Old Creamery Theater Company. He learned many aspects of theater at the Creamery where he worked on sound and lighting as well as acting.

One day, Tim was doing some work in a lighting booth above the stage in the university theater. Leigh was rehearsing a dance routine on the stage for one of her classes and had no idea that Tim was up

there. He was already attracted to Leigh

since they both were in the same English class that year. While watching her rehearse he was entranced, he was hooked! In 1975 after a whirlwind courtship, Tim proposed marriage and Leigh accepted. She left after her sophomore year at the university and received a Mrs. degree. They both began working for the Creamery. Leigh auditioned for summer stock in 1976. Both had roles in a bicentennial show which toured eight states throughout the Midwest.

In 1977 Leigh and Tim moved to Florida after completing a summer stock production of *The Taming Of The Shrew* at the Creamery. They settled in Boca Raton and Leigh finished her degree at Florida Atlantic University. Tim connected with Jan McArt's Royal Palm Theatre in Boca. He was with them for fifteen years doing scenic design and acting in their shows. Over the years, Leigh played in many musicals at Jan McArt's theater and at different theaters in many Florida cities. While working at Jan McArt's dinner theater, they both became Actors Equity members.

After the Royal Palm Theatre closed, Tim began a new job at the Caldwell Theater in Boca, which lasted twenty years. He designed their sets and acted in their plays. Nowadays he does freelance scenic design and has designed scenes for a play that has a December opening.

Leigh's career also took off. With her singing and dancing, she was a natural for musical shows. She was often in demand to be with musicals and comedies all over Florida. Tim had a relatively stable career with long time commitments that didn't require much traveling. Their marriage suffered from the stresses and strains that showbiz couples often experience. His hours were erratic. She was away for months at a time. Although they loved each other dearly, they made the difficult decision to divorce. They remained friends and encouraged each other to achieve their goals.

When Leigh was chosen to play the role of the lowa housewife in the show, *Menopause the Musical*, she was in the road show for ten years. It was a blast but didn't contribute to a harmonious home life. She especially enjoyed the role of a stripper

in the play *Gypsy*. In a hilarious scene, the experienced strippers "educated" Gypsy. They told her that she had to have a gimmick! Leigh's gimmick was playing a trumpet. She played it and sang and moved her trumpet around in a provocatively sexual way which regularly evoked laughter. If you know Leigh, can you picture her in this role?



After fifteen years of living apart, they remarried in 2013. Tim and Leigh never stopped loving each other. At this stage in their careers they were ready to accommodate each other's individual and mutual dreams. It's a joy to be in their company.

Leigh has recently appeared in a stage show in a small theater in Fort Lauderdale. In the play, she and three other 60 plus women shared their thoughts about their first sexual experiences. The title of the play is *The Lost Virginity Tour* in which they all visit the locations where each had lost her virginity. It was a funny and heartwarming story. Too bad, it closed on November 24th. Let's follow her career as she auditions for new roles.





If you think food halls are a passing trend, think again. Food halls have been around since the second century. Today, food halls from Miami's South Beach to West Palm Beach, are giving restaurants a run for their guests.



Here is a bit of history. It is said that the original food hall opened its doors in Rome around 107-110 CE during the reign of the Roman emperor Trajan.

The Trajan Market was built as a commercial building that held shops and some restaurants. The shopkeepers sold local products from across the empire like fruit, vegetables, fish, wine, oil, and spices.

Nowadays, the food halls are more sophisticated and are here to stay.

Time Out Market in Miami houses 18 eateries under one roof. All of the eateries in the food hall are outposts of restaurants

located in and around the Miami Beach area.

When you enter Time Out, the first thing you will notice is the communal tables situated throughout the space. The Main Bar is located in the center of the food hall and serves as its social hub.

They say a good cocktail makes the meal. Well, the Main Bar is staffed with bartenders from two Miami hotspots, The Broken shaker and Sweet Liberty, to shake things up. Guest bartenders from some of Miami's hottest watering holes join the ranks on special occasions.



The food scene is quite eclectic with so many choices. On a recent visit, my guests and I shared several dishes. Most notable were the Crispy Maitake Mushrooms and Shishito Peppers from Jeremy

Ford, chef at Miami's Stubborn Seed and Top Chef winner. The Maitake Mushrooms were lightly battered and crisp-fried to a golden crunch and served with grilled Shishito Peppers alongside a tangy dipping sauce.



Jeremy Ford's Conch Fritters were more like hush puppies or savory doughnuts, sweet with the flavor of fresh conch. Thai Chili Sauce complemented the dish.

Gorgio Rapicavoli, of Eating House in Coral Gables, served up sizzling Brussel Sprouts drizzled in Korean BBQ Sauce and topped with Cucumbers and Radishes.



This decadently savory sweet balance starts with large fresh brussel sprouts that are dropped in the deep fryer. Once crispy on the outside, the sprouts are quickly tossed in a lacquery sauce that coats the vegetables like glass.



Our last stop was Miami Smokers, the same BBQ joint located at the American Airlines Arena and several other locations. Good smoke is hard to resist. Miami smokers delivers on the smoke and the

tender meats. We shared the Butcher Board which consisted on Smoked Chicken Wings, Alligator Sausage and Award Winning Ribs. The Butcher Board is enough for two people as an entrée and three for an appetizer, the BBQ was soul-satisfying, comfort food.

Located just a few blocks from the Convention Center, Time Out is worth the trip. Parking is easy at the nearby public parking garage.



REUSE, REPURPOSE . . .

SALT

Lois Wiesler

- Pick up a dropped egg. If an egg breaks on the kitchen floor, sprinkle salt on the mess and leave it there for 20 minutes. You'll be able to wipe it right up.
- Soothe a bee sting. Wet the sting right away, then cover it with salt.
- Eliminate a grease fire. Pour salt on top to smother it.
 (Never use water on a grease fire.)
- Clean up oven spills. If food boils over onto the oven floor, sprinkle salt on top to stop smoke and odor from forming.
 When the oven is cool, it'll be easy to brush away the spot.
- Kill Poison Ivy. Add three pounds of salt to a gallon of soapy water. Spray it onto leaves and stems.
- Make cream whip more easily and egg whites whip faster and higher. Add a pinch of salt.
- Kill grass growing in cracks in the cement or between patio stones. Sprinkle salt on the grass and pour very hot water

- over it. Or sprinkle coarse salt on the grass, let stand all day or overnight, then pour hot tap water over it.
- Clean a glass coffee pot. Fill it with 1/4 cup of table salt and a dozen ice cubes. Swish the mixture around, let it sit for half an hour, fill it with cold water and rinse.
- Clean tarnished copper. Fill a 16-ounce spray bottle with hot white vinegar and three tablespoons of salt. Spray it onto the copper, let it sit briefly, then rub clean. (Don't do this to lacquered copper.)
- Clean coffee and tea stains from china cups. Rub them with salt.
- Keep potatoes and apples from turning brown once they're sliced. Put them in salted cold water.
- Clean a cutting board. Cover it with bleach and salt, scrub it with a stiff brush, then rinse with very hot water and wipe with a clean cloth. Repeat with each use.


