I hope the restart of the Weekly Outdoor Concerts can be accelerated to a December date for our many Snowbirds to enjoy what they left behind in May and expected to enjoy on their return. You spoiled us and we embrace that feeling.

Without a doubt, you should receive an award for recognizing a need and using your musical talents to ensure that Rainberry Bay had more to offer than any other community in the area.

LEVITY FROM LONDON (AN OBITUARY PRINTED IN THE LONDON TIMES)

Today we mourn the passing of a beloved old friend, **Common Sense**, who has been with us for many years. No one knows for sure how old he was, since his birth records were long ago lost in bureaucratic red tape. He will be remembered as having cultivated such valuable lessons as:

- Why the early bird gets the worm;
- Life isn't always fair;
- And maybe it was my fault.

Common Sense lived by simple, sound financial policies (don't spend more than you can earn) and reliable strategies (adults, not children, are in charge).

His health began to deteriorate rapidly when well-intentioned but overbearing regulations were set in place. Reports of a 6-year-old boy charged with sexual harassment for kissing a classmate; teens suspended from school for using mouthwash after lunch; and a teacher fired for reprimanding an unruly student, only worsened his condition. Common Sense lost more ground when parents attacked teachers for doing the job that they themselves had failed to do in disciplining their unruly children.

His condition declined even further when schools were required to get parental

consent to administer sun lotion or an aspirin to a student; but could not inform parents when a student became pregnant and wanted to have an abortion.

Common Sense lost the will to live as the churches became businesses; and criminals received better treatment than their victims. Common Sense took a beating when you couldn't defend yourself from a burglar in your own home and the burglar could sue you for assault.

Common Sense was preceded in death by his parents, Truth and Trust, by his wife,

MASTER DOCUMENT VOTE—THE NEXT STEP!

By now you should have received an email with a preview of the three proposed Master Association Documents, along with a list of changes and additions that were made, to help you navigate through them. We hope you have had a chance to look them over and are now ready for the "Main Event"!

Shortly, you will be receiving a packet in the mail with a printed copy of those same documents along with a ballot to fill out and return. The ballot will list the three documents, The Declaration, the Articles of Incorporation, and the Bylaws, and ask you to mark APPROVE or

DISAPPROVE for each one. You will then sign the ballot, print your name and enter your address so that your ballot can be properly recorded, and return it in the postage-paid envelope.

For those of you who have signed up for Electronic Voting, you will receive an email from Rainberry Bay that will give you instructions on how to cast your vote and will include a copy of the proposed documents.

To make things even more convenient, there will be a number of opportunities to speak with representatives at locations such as the pools, sports facilities, clubhouse, and theater. These volunteers will have ballots and privacy envelopes with them for you to use. Look in the December and January eblasts for locations and times when they will be available.

Our goal is to have as many residents as possible participate in this important vote. You can help us by casting your vote as soon as you receive the packet so we can concentrate on reaching out to those that haven't returned their ballot.

Log in with your ID and go to Forms & Documents and select ACC FORM. Print, fill it out and return it to the Management office.

AMENITIES:

 We are getting more proposals for a better lighting plan for the Pickleball courts 11 & 12 to be submitted for approval by the Board.

ROADWAY PROJECT:

- Permitting process is currently being renegotiated.
- Progress is being made but we still face obstacles.
- We are trying to save as many trees from removal as we can, determined by our Arborist report and City of Delray Beach Engineers.

LANDSCAPING:

- The community will be removing trees that are a nuisance and doing damage to buildings and utility services.
- Several hedges have been added to our perimeter hedge to fill in for better security and privacy. The project is ongoing.
- Palm Beach Broward Landscaping moving forward making the community better through its cycles of service.
- The Board approved that the north perimeter tree/hedge will be cut back excessively.
- PBB is continually adjusting the new irrigation system to provide consistent watering.
- Community border hedges have all been reduced in size to a maintainable level. Schedule maps are available.
- Community planting improvements are being done upon recommendation from our Landscape Committee.

MISCELLANEOUS:

- As always, we appreciate constructive input from our community.
- The Landscaping Oversight Committee is continually completing small projects to enhance the optics of our community.
- Please be reminded that any changes to the exterior of any unit must be approved by the ACC Committee before any work being done. Application forms can be obtained at the management office. Please call to request.
- The ducks should not be fed. It is unhealthy for them and for our beautiful lake, contributing to bad algae. Please refrain from feeding any of the wildlife on our grounds.

MEET YOUR NEIGHBORS: STILL DANCING

PHYLLIS BERKE

Every Sunday night during my junior year in high school, I danced the foxtrot, rumba, and lindy hop in a basement room of a Jewish temple on the corner of Nostrand Avenue and Quentin Road in Brooklyn. All week long, I looked forward to being there. My girlfriends and I walked together from our street. I danced every dance to hit records of the time. Nowadays, all I have to do is hear Glenn Miller, Tommy Dorsey, Frank Sinatra, or Perry Como songs to be transported to that basement dance floor. Tears come to my eyes and my body starts moving to the rhythm.

Boys I knew from school and some I didn't know kept me dancing all night. I was pretty and loved dressing up to go to the dance. One of my favorite dance partners was Freddie, a brainy boy I knew from high school.

For my sixteenth birthday, my parents threw a party for me at the New Yorker Hotel in Manhattan. We had a huge table in the nightclub which had a stage show. Anyway, I loved Larry, the boy next door, and Freddie, my classmate, loved me. My mother wanted me to choose Freddie as my guest for the evening, but I stuck to my guns and invited Larry. In my mind, I expected him to dress in a sharp gabardine suit like movie stars wore. But he showed up in a tweed jacket that was too small on him. What a blow! It was probably his bar mitzvah jacket. I got over it and life went on.

A year or so later, I entered Brooklyn College as a freshman. I majored in English and soon located the lounge which played popular dance music every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 12 to 2. Who needed classes? I was content to hang out in the lounge, but no classes were taught anyway during those sacrosanct hours of the week. And that's where I met Sid Gordon, my husband-to-be.

Sid became a favorite dance partner of mine. He was a great dancer. He was tall

She, in turn, told me how wonderful she thought he was. The first day I got my yellow and red button, I wore it proudly above my left breast. It had my name on it. When Sid saw it, he said to me, "You call that one Phyllis, what do you call the other one?" I guess he thought he was being clever but I had no idea what he was talking about!

We had a flirty kind of relationship at the college. It was fun. But I still danced often with other boys. One day, when he was following me around more than usual, I asked him, "What is it you want?" He sang, "Just a little fond affection, that is all I want from you," which was a popular song at the time. Not long after that, Sid said that he was going to marry me. So, to be a good guest, I said I would share a bed with her father. The rest is history. And we are still dancing.





Keeping Us Informed

USING CITRUS AROUND THE HOUSE

Lois Wiesler

- For greasy messes, sprinkle affected area with salt or baking soda (to act as an abrasive) and then rub with juiced clean lemon halves. (Be careful using lemon on sensitive surfaces such as marble.)
- To shine your coffee pot, follow the old diner trick to make glass coffee pots sparkle. Add ice, salt and lemon rinds to an empty coffee pot; swirl around for a minute or two, dump and rinse well.
- To clean your tea kettle of mineral deposit build-up, fill the vessel with water and a handful of lemon peels and bring to a boil. Turn off heat, let sit for an hour, drain and rinse well.
- To refresh your face, make a skin tonic of orange or grapefruit peels. Rub the orange or grapefruit peels on your face (avoiding your eyes) and then gently rinse with warm water.
- 5. To enhance food:
 - A. Make a citrus extract powder by making zest or twists (lemons, limes, oranges, or grapefruit). Be sure to remove the pith and allow to dry, about three or four days for twists, less for zest. Put in a blender (or spice grinder) and pulverize into a powder. Store in a clean jar.
 - B. Make citrus sugar: Make citrus extract powder and add it to sugar, or you can use fresh twists, put them in a jar with sugar, let the oil from the peel infuse the sugar and remove.
 - C. Make lemon pepper: Mix lemon extract powder with freshly cracked pepper.
 - D. Make zest: If you've juiced lemons, limes, oranges or grapefruit but don't have an immediate need for zest, you can make it anyway and dry or freeze it for future use. Zest is a versatile item to have on hand for a bright boost in any number of dishes. If you don't have a microplane or zester, you can also use the small side of a box grater. Try to scrape just the outer layer, the white layer of pith is bitter. Freeze in an airtight container. To dry, spread the zest on a towel and leave until dried, then store in a clean jar.



Pre-Covid you may have seen a white Volunteer Police car patrolling up and down our streets in Rainberry Bay. Like many things during Covid, the Delray Beach Police Department (DBPD) suspended this important and valuable resource to the communities of Delray Beach.

Now the DBPD is reorganizing its partnership with Volunteers, including the COP (Citizens Observer Patrol) program. COP Volunteers work in seven communities within Delray Beach, acting as the eyes and ears for the Police Department in the neighborhoods where they live. COP Volunteers play a significant role in supporting the members of the Delray Beach Police Department. They have been directly responsible for reducing crime in their areas by as much as 75%. This Police-driven alliance has improved the overall quality of life for us who live in Delray Beach. All patrols are equipped with uniforms and Police Volunteer vehicles.

Our Rainberry Bay Volunteers patrol in five assigned nearby communities of Delray Beach, on a two-hour-long shift, with a minimum commitment of one shift per week. We need more Volunteers in Rainberry Bay, and we hope we can count on you. WINTER SEASON IS UPON US

- 1. Rainberry documents require a minimum of two (2) years of ownership BEFORE a unit may be rented.
- 2. Rentals are allowed once per fiscal year (October 1-September 30) and must be for a minimum of three (3) consecutive months and a maximum of twelve (12) months.
- 3. Furnish terms of signed Lease and Rental Agreement.
- Landlords MUST furnish a copy of the Landlord Permit issued by the City of Delray Beach with the completed application and lease.






